









Course Overview

This course reflects the role of health and aged care professionals working with people living with dementia. It focuses on the leadership skills required to implement positive change in the workplace and improve the care for people living with dementia. A key focus is on applying a person-centred care approach, the course will cover contemporary care practices that will lead to better care planning and improved client outcomes.

This course provides participants with the following vocational outcomes:

- » Apply a person-centred approach and implement contemporary care practices leading to improved outcomes for people living with dementia, including those with younger onset dementia.
- Work in a multidisciplinary team
- » Contribute to care planning
- » Apply risk identification and minimisation strategies to dementia care and services
- » Record, report, and manage information
- » Plan and implement care services for people in palliative care
- » Undertake responsibilities within scope of own work role according to organisation policies and protocols

- » Plan enabling environments for people living with dementia
- » Contribute to effective working relations
- » Apply critical reflective practice to own work role
- » Apply culturally safe practices in the workplace
- » Promote creativity and innovation in service provision
- Empower and promote independence of people receiving support
