

Course Overview

In accredited training, a skill set refers to a defined group of competencies that enable individuals to perform specific tasks or roles to nationally recognised standards. Training is mapped to formal units of competency within a training package endorsed by the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA).

These Skill Sets form part of the 11229NAT Certificate IV in Leadership and Innovation Dementia Services and are designed to further enhance specific skill within your role, including:

- » Dementia Support
- » Dementia Care
- » Leadership in Dementia
- » Palliative Care
- » Diversity and Professional Practice

Purpose and Use of Skill Sets

Targeted Upskilling: Ideal for workers who wish to gain specific capabilities without completing a full qualification.

Workforce Flexibility: Enables employers to quickly build capability in response to changing service models or regulatory shifts.

Pathways to Qualifications: Skill sets are credited toward full qualifications, supporting lifelong learning and career progression.

Shorter: These skill sets are delivered over a shorter period (depending on the number of units within the set) and students can do one or multiple skill sets when convenient.

CHCSS00123 Dementia Support

This skill set is for individuals who hold a qualification at Certificate III level or higher in Community Services, Health or a related field, work in various care and support roles, and who wish to develop skills in supporting people with dementia.

It contains two nationally recognised units of competency:

CHCAGE011 Provide support to people living with dementia

CHCCCS044 Follow established person-centered behaviour supports

AWA001 Specialist Dementia Care

This course reflects the role of health and aged care professionals working with people living with dementia. It focuses on three specialised areas in dementia care which includes:

- » Creating enabling environments for people living with dementia
- » Understanding younger onset dementia
- » Minimising impact of social stigma for the person living with dementia

It contains three nationally recognised units of competency:

NAT11229001 Plan enabling environments for people living with dementia

NAT11229002 Provide support to people living with younger onset dementia

NAT11229003 Develop strategies to reduce stigma associated with living with dementia

AWA002 Leadership in Dementia Care

This skill set reflects the role of health and aged care professionals working with people living in dementia. This skill set includes:

- » Promoting innovation within team environments in an aged care facility
- » Advise, carry out and evaluate customer service strategies in an aged care facility
- » Lead a team effectively by modelling organisation values and industry standards

AWA003 Palliative Care

This skill set reflects the role of health and aged care professionals working with people who require palliative care. This skill set includes:

- » Empowering people who receive support
- » Planning and implementing care using a palliative approach

CHCPAL004 Contribute to the planning and implementation of care services using a palliative approach

CHCCCS038 Facilitate the empowerment of people receiving support

AWA004 Diversity and Professional Practice

This skill set reflects the legal and ethical policies, the diverse workforce and professional practice when working in a Community Service role, especially in the Aged Care sector. This skill set includes:

- » Reflection of own work practice
- » Working with diverse people
- » Working legally and ethically

This Skil Set contains three nationally recognised units of competency:

CHCPRP003 Reflect on and improve own professional practice

CHCDIV001 Work with diverse people

CHCLEG001 Work legally and ethically
